THERE ARE OVER 6,000 CHILDREN & YOUTH IN FOSTER CARE IN THE STATE OF ALABAMA.

Children are removed from their homes and placed in foster care due to abuse, neglect, or abandonment. The compounding traumas of this experience, the removal itself, multiple placement changes, and a system that too often lets children slip through the cracks, lead to other issues.



50% of foster homes close within the first year.



50% of youth in care graduate from high school.



3% of former foster youth will graduate from college.

RELATIONSHIP BUILDING

> Devote time and energy to fostering healthy relationships that promote healing through connections and interpersonal bonding.



MENTORSHIP

Equip and empower vouth to be prepared for independent living and to reach their fullest potential.



Ensuring children and caregivers have the tools, resources, and support needed for long-term placement.



INTENTIONAL GIVING

Give thoughtful and personal resources, gifts, and care packages that meet the real needs of the child and their entire family.

Statistics say that youth in foster care are less likely to graduate from high school and college, and more likely to struggle with their mental health, become homeless, be humantrafficked, or go to prison.

LOVE BOX PROGRAM

The Love Box program focuses on holistically supporting and sustaining fostering families. Volunteers spend time building relationships with all members of the family by playing games, sharing meals, and connecting, while also delivering monthly personal care packages (Love Boxes) based on the family's current needs.
